Your Mail-in Ballot is also Your In-person Ballot

If you are an eligible producer, you will find your official election ballot for the 2018 ALP Board election inserted with the Fall issue of the ALP *N'ewesletter*. For the first time, you have the option of mailing in your ballot or voting in-person at our AGM on Nov 3. In either case, you **will need** the ballot provided with this *N'ewesletter*. Only one ballot may be cast by each eligible producer or corporation.

There are four Director-at-Large positions to be filled on the 2018/19 Board. As these are Director-at-Large positions, you may vote for any of the candidates (i.e. no restrictions due to zone or geographical location). Please see page below for profiles of the candidates.

To vote by mail-in ballot:

- 1. The ballot and an envelope addressed to the ALP office are provided with this N'ewesletter.
- 2. Directors will be elected based on a ranking system. All boxes on the ballot must be filled in with numbers 1 to 5, from #1 as your first choice to #5 as your last choice. If the ballot is not completed correctly, it will be considered spoiled and will not be counted.
- 3. Insert the ballot into the envelope and seal it well. Do not write your name or any identifiable mark on your ballot. It must be anonymous.
- 4. Place a stamp (not provided) and drop off at your nearest post office or mail box on or before Oct 20th. Your ballot number will be checked off the master list once your mail-in vote is received. Ballots will not be counted until after polls close at the AGM. You can only vote once, even if you attend the AGM.
- 5. Ballots post marked after October 20th will not be counted.

Please contact the ALP office if you have any questions about mailing in your ballot.

To vote in-person:

- 1. Put your ballot in a safe place and be sure to bring it to the AGM on Nov 3^{rd.} (Don't forget to RSVP your attendance by Oct 29th so you can have a meal included!)
- 2. Use your ballot to cast your vote once the polls open at the AGM in Leduc on Nov 3rd.
