Wild boar are native to Europe and Asia, in North America, they are considered a pest.

Signs of wild boar:

- digging/rooting
- wallowing/rolling
- hair on barbed wire
- trampled crops
- tracks and trails



reproduce multiple times a year, between 5-12 months old, with litters of 6 piglets



Wild boar at large can host 89 different diseases that can be transmitted to livestock, wildlife and humans.
